RECOMMENDATIONS

28 February – 1 March 2023 - Pattaya, Thailand

1. National strategies in line with ASEAN Border Management Cooperation Roadmap
 - a. Establish a **regional standards and policy baseline**
 - b. Develop a **National Plan of Action** with SOPs on border management
 - c. Invest in a **human centered risk-based approach** to enable authorities for early identification of threats posed by organized crime
 - d. **Mainstream gender** in the field of border management
2. Information exchange
 - a. Emphasize Action Point 9 of the Border Management Cooperation Roadmap, which seeks to further operationalize the **Border Liaison Office (BLO)** network
 - b. Improve the systematic **collection of data** on all forms of transnational organized crime
 - c. Strengthen **collaboration on information sharing** and capacity building under the DGICM framework
 - d. Improve channels of coordination and communication on information exchange with **relevant law enforcement authorities**
3. Law enforcement matters and institutional capacity building
 - a. Promote the use of **advanced technologies** in border management
 - b. Reinforce the law enforcement sector's **capacity building and monitoring tools** in vulnerable border areas
 - c. Work with **training academies and academia** to strengthen border management components and awareness in their training curricula
 - d. Enhance **human rights due diligence** in border management capacity building
4. 5. **Border Communities**
 - a. **Develop community empowerment** initiatives that strengthen engagement between officials, community leaders and CSOs in border areas

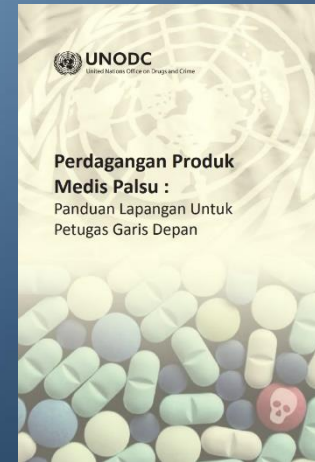
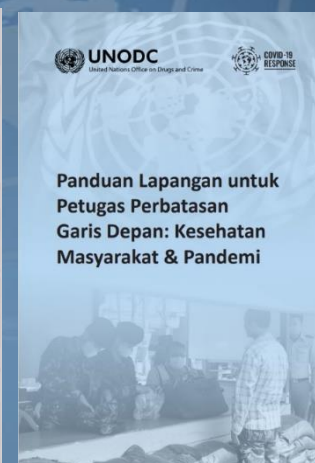
